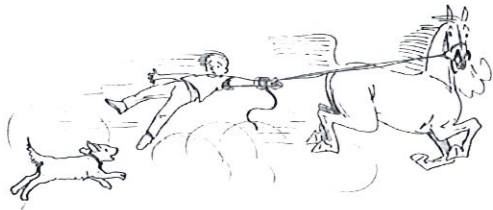


Only registered volunteers are permitted in stall area during classes. Volunteers and visitors must contact the office to be on premise during non-class hours. (474-5276) Volunteers are discouraged from going into boarder aisles.



No pets, please. All children must be closely supervised.

Volunteers should not enter stalls before the Instructor or the Instructor's Assistant has arrived (one hour before the start of class). Leaders and Leaders-in-

training should have a green name tag. Certify new leaders ASAP. Instructors

should always check tack and tighten girths before starting mounting procedure. (Avoid tightening girths at the mounting block.) Do not

leave a mounted rider unattended at block. (Walk horse forward to

adjust right stirrup.) No one should walk behind horse in sight of students. (in arena or mounting area) No one

should ever kneel or even squat down next to a

horse. Bend at the waist. All staff and volunteers should know the location

of fire extinguishers, first aid

kits, AED, emergency

phone numbers and

directions to

TREC.

TREC Policies Regarding Grooming / Tacking and Leading:



Unless otherwise instructed, all horses should be tied while

being tacked, either in cross ties or with a

quick release knot or short trailer safety ties to

ring in the stall. (Never tie to anything else in stall or

out.) NEVER tie by the bridle. Once the horse has been

bridled he needs to be hand held at all times, preferably by a

certified Leader or Leader-in-Training. Horses should not be

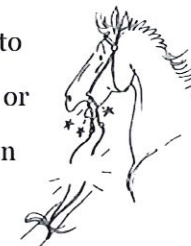
loose in stalls while saddled. All tied horses should be supervised. Only volunteers
